Landscape Architecture Month + Active Living = TRAIL DESIGN WORKSHOP (Fun for all!)



Charlottesville area members of the Virginia Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) will be celebrating FLO's legacy and his pioneering efforts to improve public health by joining the Albemarle County Department of Parks and Recreation for a Trail Design Workshop on **Saturday, April 14, 2012**. Landscape architects will apply their talents to a portion of the Old Mills Trail on the Rivanna River. Trail enthusiasts and the general public are invited to work with the Landscape architects to examine the site and design solutions to its numerous challenges.

The event will run from 8:30 am until about noon and involves a 1-mile walk from the Martha Jefferson Hospital area (see map) to the river and back. Wear good walking shoes, check the weather forecast, and make sure you are dressed appropriately to be out for the morning.
